Councillors for COMMON WARD



DAVID HAWKSWORTH

Elected 2016, David is Leader of the Ashtead Independents and the Informal Independent Group in the Council. A research biologist and ecologist, he was Director of a research institute, and now holds honorary positions at the Royal Botanic Gardens Kew and The Natural History Museum London; he was appointed CBE in 1996.

Married to Cllr Wiltshire, he has served on the Standing Committee of the Ashtead Residents'

Association and Ashtead Community Vision Forum, and as Chair of St Stephen's House Surgery Patient Participation Group. He helped establish the Ashtead Tree Wardens, was the Cabinet Member for Wellbeing in 2018-19, and is on the Development Management, Surrey County Council Local, and Ashtead Common Consultative Committees.

Now Vice-Chair of the Council, and re-elected in 2018, Patricia's background is as a university lecturer and researcher in ecology and archaeology. She has worked for 25 years as a forensic ecologist in serious crime, and is an expert witness. She is a visiting professor at the University of Southampton. She has lived in Ashtead for nearly 40 years. She was Cabinet Member for Environment in 2018-19 and sits on Committees which include Development Management. She was the founding Chair of the South Downs Patient Participation Group Forum,

and served on Ashtead Community Vision Forum.

Elected in 2016, David is from an engineering background (formerly MIET). David was Deputy chair of the Scrutiny Committee from 2016-2017 and Cabinet Member for Planning Policy in 2018-19, with a particular responsibility for exploring options for zones to be allocated for housing and economic development within the new Local Plan for the District. He now serves on the Scrutiny Committee, and is a substitute on the Development Management Committee.

■ Alan Reilly



Your Ashtead Independents and the District and County Councils

REPRESENTING ASHTEAD

- Ashtead provides seven of Mole Valley District Council's 41 Councillors, all seven are Ashtead Independents (AIs), as is our single County Councillor.
- Ashtead is split into three Wards, each served by two or three AI councillors (see map).
- All AI Councillors live in Ashtead.
- Councillors are elected for four years, usually in May. Elections are staggered.
- Five AIs have experience as Cabinet Members and portfolio holders.
- Als are independent of national party politics. Although we discuss and seek to agree on local issues, there is no whip and each votes as he or she sees fit.
- We work closely with the Ashtead Residents' Association, but are not mandated or financially supported by them.

Which Council does what in Ashtead?

Mole Valley District Council:

MVDC empties our bins, maintains our public open spaces, the Wood Field, the Oueen Elizabeth II Playing Field (Recreation Ground) and Ashtead Park. It makes licensing and planning decisions, allocates public sector housing, enforces parking and other infringements, and addresses nuisances. MVDC also owns the Leatherhead Leisure Centre.



SURREY COUNTY COUNCIL:

SCC looks after our roads, provides schools, was responsible for the expansion of The Greville and St. Peter's, runs the Library, and is the main provider of Children's, Youth and Adult Social Services.
